Our confidential counseling is free of charge, and offers expectant parents a safe place to explore all options: parenting, abortion and adoption. We're here to listen and offer compassion and resources.

We understand you may feel overwhelmed and unsure about where to go from here. At OA&FS, we value your involvement and are committed to creating a comfortable environment for expectant parents. We also understand you may have differing views, and we are here to help you navigate challenging conversations.

We're a nonprofit, pro-choice agency not affiliated with any religion, and will treat you with dignity and respect.

We welcome and encourage birth father participation in our open adoption program. Through our child-centered open adoptions, we'll help you form a lifelong relationship with your child and the adoptive family.





Choosing open adoption? Here's how to get involved.




You will always be a part of your child's life.

Your child will grow up knowing you, and knowing that you love them.



Build a lifelong relationship.

We'll help you create a genuine relationship with the adoptive family that's much like extended family.



Meet with a counselor. You'll be treated with dignity and respect as you plan your adoption. You're welcome to meet with us individually or as a couple.



Help choose the adoptive family.

You choose from more than 65-85 families who genuinely want a relationship with you. You're provided extensive information and meet the family prior to an adoption plan



Have ongoing visits with your child and their family.

You will always have contact with your child. Your ongoing visits are guaranteed through a legally enforceable adoption agreement.
