

We learned we like visiting caves, but the pictures didn't always turn out well!




We encountered lots of different weather and feel more in tune with the seasons now.

Our time together has taken us across the country!

























### I'm Cody Ray!


Bears are my favorite animal! When I saw this carved chair in Montana I just couldn't resist a picture!

Rusty is always down for a car ride, even as a puppy! You couldn't mention the word without perking up his little ears!




But bike rides aren't the same as car rides. Bike rides aren't fun until we start moving!



We'd like to carry on the tradition of spending time in the outdoors with our child camping or hiking.





We're homebodies - we like being at home. Even when we are on vacation, we like having a home base to ground ourselves with!




Christmas with John's family is always a blast! From food to games, then back for more food, the family is always ready for a party!
