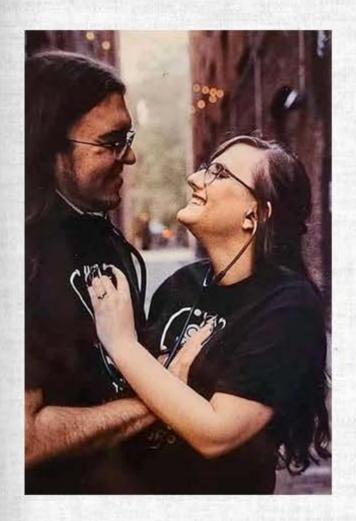




MARC AND KARINA

OUR STORY ...

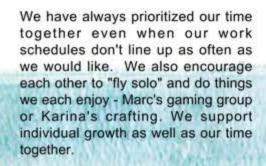

On our first date Marc bewitched Karina with his engaging storytelling and love of caregiving - revealing that Karina is easily moved to tears. She doesn't recommend crying on a first date but this time it worked. Over the years we have grown together, shared many jokes and some more tears. When Karina went back to school for nursing Marc was with her every step of the way.

We both live with mental health issues. This is something we share with the people in our lives as an act of vulnerability and to fight against stigma. We know that good community and healthcare can allow people with mental health challenges to live full and loving lives. Both diagnosed with type 2 bipolar disorder, we have been engaged in successful treatment for many years. This affects us each differently, but we work together to find balance and a beautiful life together. Our experiences have helped shape our professional lives as we follow our strengths and passion to help people on their worst days.







Despite having different tastes, we love to spend time together doing the things we love. We have been taking weekly dance lessons as a date night and have graduated from stepping on each other's toes to spinning around the dance floor.

We've also learned even more about each other's musical taste; it turns out Marc likes the Tango and Karina likes the Hustle. Most importantly we have learned that even doing something poorly together can be fun.

We both love food and getting out of the house to explore our city one bite at a time. Marc finds the best barbecue and Karina finds the best sushi. Our favorite place to be together is near the Pacific Ocean. There is just something magical about the roar of the ocean and the sand in our toes.

I was born by Waikiki Beach in Hawaii and have lived as close to the water as possible ever since. My happy place is where there is fresh sea air. I grew up close to my immediate and extended family. At one point there were five cousins enrolled at the same elementary school! I also have a little brother, who is way taller than me now.

My stepdaughter Lauren is the coolest kiddo I know - I have been blessed to have her in my life! I am close to my nieces and sister-in-law and try to see the family whenever I can. It has been a delight watching Lauren and my nieces grow up.

My parents are a big support, and we are active in each other's lives. I am also blessed to have a chosen family of long-time childhood friends whom I have known since early elementary school.

My best memories take place near the water - from learning to sail to looking for sand dollars the week of our wedding. I am a huge ocean nerd and still try to get a closer look in every tide pool. My favorite books take place at sea and favorite songs are about the water.

I have worked in pediatric nursing for more than 6 years and focused the entire time on children's mental and emotional health. My favorite quote from a mentor is "your brain is a part of your body and should be treated like it." Children should be given support when they struggle and kindness as they grow. Nursing allows me to combine my love of science and people. I have worked at multiple levels of healthcare, starting as a nursing assistant when I met Marc, before going back to school to become a nurse.















One of my biggest childhood challenges was working through school with two learning disabilities. I learned that not everyone cares about how hard you work but are strictly focused on results. They look at education as an accomplishment and not a process. I spent a lot of time feeling inferior to my peers because I had to ask for help with things that seemed so easy for others. I had a hard time learning to read and write, and with my ADHD just sitting still in class to pay attention was rough.

These things shaped my path to children's mental health in a way. I see growth and development as things to be nurtured into being. Isolation holds kids, and grown-ups, back. I value compassionate interactions more than almost anything else. I want to help kids find joy and resiliency.

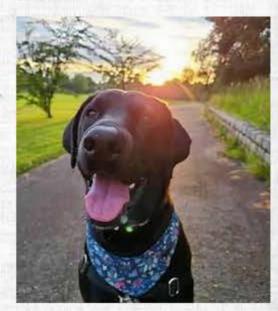


Cerbie's Fun Facts:

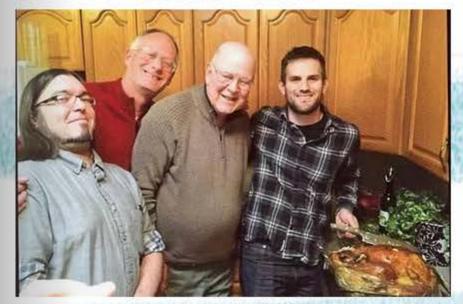

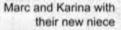




Karina's family have many traditions with the winter holidays. She bakes a German Christmas bread called Stollen that has been made in the family for 100+ years.
