

Our table is the center of our home; it was made from wood that Nikyta and Vern hand milled from Vern's trees. We eat Sunday dinner around it every week together!
















We are happy that it's still safe here for kids to explore forests & beaches, bike quiet rural roads, and play outside with their friends.

We are lucky to know many of the parents and children.


To the right: The Procession of the Species parade: A pod of Oreas with fins and a Sea Star.
