
GROWING UP


COLLEGE AND CAREER



Watching sports with my family was always a raucous event, complete with superstitious 'curses' on the opposing team, screams of celebration, and cries of indignation at the refs. I am still a Lakers fan, and am an assistant basketball coach at my school.
